- Inspect all cords and light strings for frayed wires or other defects, especially those that will be on trees.
- Be sure to keep natural trees well-watered.

As we are now looking at Fiona in the rear-view mirror, many are thinking of the ample supply of firewood she has created. This wood that has come down from the hurricane needs to be seasoned well before it can be used in home heating appliances to avoid buildup of creosote and cause potential flue fires.

Torch Relay



Prior to each Canada Games, a Torch Relay is held as an invitation to our country to join in the journey of the Games.

On October 17, the Roly McLenahan Canada Games Torch was lit from the Centennial Flame on Parliament Hill. To date, it has travelled through several Maritime locations and across several communities on PEI.

On the evening of January 24, we are thrilled the 2023 Canada Games Torch will run, walk, and wheel a 5-kilometre route through the Murray Harbour area, carried by our 13 Torch Bearers. The Torch Bearers, chosen from nominations submitted in June of 2022 and announced in October, are a well-rounded group coming from a wide range of backgrounds, demographics, athletic, cultural, and community organizations.

Following the completion of the relay, which will be at the Murray Harbour Community Centre, a celebration will be held to showcase the unique culture, music, history, and pride of our community and our Island overall. Final plans for the relay route and celebration are in progress and will be announced shortly. □

Canadian Community Building Fund Projects

The centrefold included in this newsletter shows several of the projects planned for 2023 around the Community Centre and at the wharf. Haute Nature, the architectural firm hired to provide professional services, developed these preliminary drawings and will be giving a presentation to Council early in the new year. This would be great opportunity for you to learn more about these exciting works. Keep an eye on our electronic sign, our website, and social media for the date and time. Green Energy: The 61 solar panels are installed and working on the Community Centre roof. This array has a 27.45 kW capacity with estimated yearly savings to our power bill of over \$5,000.

Sidewalk Extension: The extension of the sidewalk from the Post Office to Robertson Road was unsuccessful in tendering for the job. In fact, only one bid was received, and it was three times the engineer's estimate. Back to the drawing board to see if we can get a bid for next spring!

Sewage Lagoon Access Road and Fencing: Complete.

Community Garden/Public Washroom: See centrefold.

Soccer Field: Complete.

Community Office Basement: Complete with addition of two humidex controls to complement the circulation and ventilation HRV system.

Outdoor Sports and Recreation: See centrefold.

Recreation Improvements: Ball hockey bumpers finally arrived; ready for next year!

Heritage Park: See centrefold. Efforts continue to remove the old school bell from the Fire Hall roof.

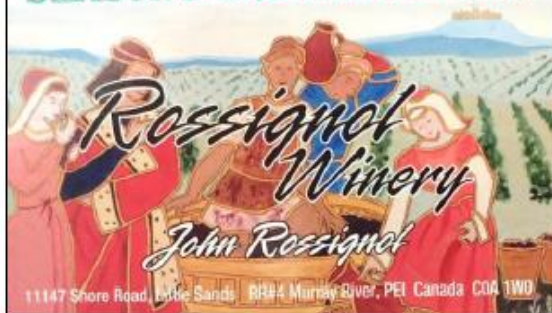

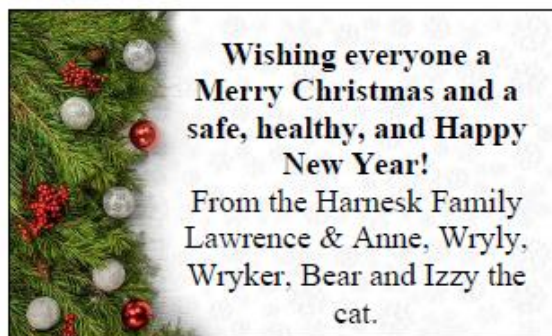

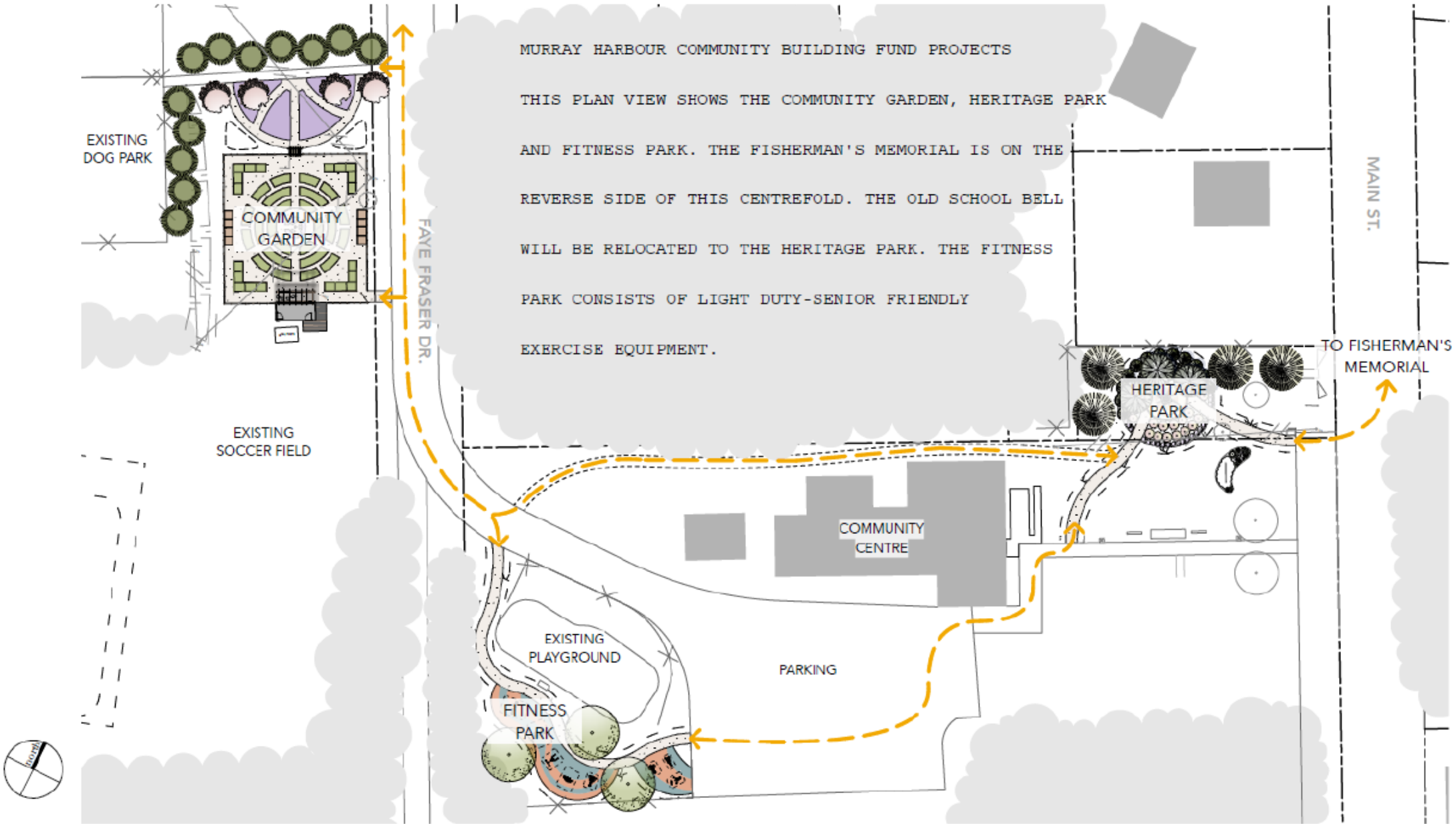
