

Canadian Community Building Fund Projects

There are numerous projects scheduled for the coming construction season in the Village. The sidewalk extension from the Post Office south to the corner at the Baptist Church has been awarded to Somerset Gardens Inc. from Kinkora. Planned start date is mid-May. This project should take about 6 weeks to complete and will provide a safe walkway for pedestrians using this segment of the village's roads.

The Fisherman's Memorial, Heritage Park, and Fitness Park are all planned to be completed over the coming months. Hopefully the tender will have been awarded by the time of publishing this newsletter and these projects will begin to take shape shortly.

The community garden will be in operation this spring for its inaugural season! Site preparation will occur as Canadian Community Building, con'd

soon as weather permits with construction of a new storage shed, elevated planters and compost bin following in time for the 2023 growing season. If you're interested in using some space, contact Anne Harnesk at the Village Office and she will put you on the list.

The solar panels came online last September and are working well on the Community Centre roof. We are looking forward to generating power at an elevated rate through the summer and reducing our power bill even further.

Call Out to Artists



Seniors Food Program


The provincial government is expanding the Seniors' Food Pilot Program to Murray Harbour and Murray River. PEI seniors in Murray River and Murray Harbour, aged 65 and older, can register as of April 25 to receive up to five meals per week. Seniors who are eligible for the program will pay a flat rate of \$4 per meal, as the Department of Social Development and Seniors will cover the remaining costs. To be eligible for the pilot program, seniors must be eligible for the Seniors Independence Initiative.


Meal delivery and pick-up will take place every Monday, as of May 1.

- Those picking up their weekly meals can do so at the Home Plate in Murray River between 9 a.m. and 2 p.m. on Mondays.
- The Home Plate will deliver meals between 10:30 a.m. and 3 p.m. on Mondays. Participants must arrange to have someone present at the delivery location during this time.
- All meals will be pre-cooked and reheatable.

To apply, call the Department of Social Development and Seniors at 1-902-368-6369. The following information will be needed to register:

- full name
- date of birth
- provincial health number (PHN)
- household income (proof of income required to be eligible for partial meal payment)
- home address
- food allergies and/or dietary restrictions
- delivery instructions.





Are You Ready?

Did you know that in the event of an emergency you should be ready to shelter in your home for the first 72 hours?

Emergencies like Hurricane Fiona have taught us the importance of being prepared for anything.

Emergency preparedness involves three basic steps:

- 1. Know the risks;
- 2. Make a plan;
- 3. Create an emergency kit.

While reception/warming centres will open as soon as it is safe to do so, you need to be prepared to stay in your home for the first 72 hours following any emergency (blizzard, power outages, ice storms, hurricanes, storm surges, and hazardous material accidents).

A basic emergency kit includes:

- √ Water (at least 2 litres/person/day);
- ✓ Food that won't spoil such as canned food, energy bars and dried food (replace food and water once/year);
- ✓ Manual can opener;
- ✓ Crank or battery-operated flashlight and radio (and extra batteries);
- ✓ First Aid kit;
- ✓ Extra keys to your car and house;

- ✓ Cash in smaller bills;
- ✓ Items such as prescription medications, infant formula, equipment for people with disabilities, food, water and medications for your pets/service animals.

Important reminders for the Murray Harbour Community Centre in the event that it becomes a reception/warming centre:

- ✓ While we will try to open the centre as quickly as possible, please be aware that we will not open until it is safe for emergency response members to do so;
- ✓ Should you need to access water from the centre, make sure that you bring an appropriate water container. The centre is only able to provide water for personal consumption to ensure that the well is not at risk of drying up;
- ✓ While the emergency response team will do their best to try to provide some meals, please understand that it may be limited to light meals;
- ✓ Please do not bring any expired or thawed food to the reception centre as we are not able to accept such donations.
