Murray Harbour's First Annual Floor Curling Bonspiel, held on December 29 at the Community Centre, was a lively event with 20 curlers.

Floor curling is quickly becoming a popular sport in Murray Harbour. In November, Go East PEI provided the community with a couple of sets of rocks (with ball bearings on the bottom to help slide) and push sticks. The sport is accessible to all players as the push sticks eliminate the need for players to slide on the floor; instead, rocks are pushed from a standing or sitting position.

At the December event, Team #7 (Faye White, Lora Ann MacPhee, and Elaine Herring) won 6-3 over Team #6 (Paul White, Carol White, and Diane MacDonald) to capture the top position. Councillor Glen White was on hand to

Hello to all community residents and people in neighbouring areas of the Rural Municipality of Murray Harbour. Since taking office in December, council members have been hard at work learning the ins and outs of the new *Municipal Government Act*, which is being

implemented over the next couple of years. Together, we're studying the Act to determine how it impacts us. I believe more power is being shifted from the provincial government and put into the hands of the municipality, which will put more costs on us. There are a lot of new or different items in this Act. We've put some into practice, but there is still much more to be put in place with deadlines. Council members have been assigned various responsibilities and committee duties (see the list on the back page). One more councillor will be elected at the upcoming byelection on April 29th.

Councillors put in a lot of volunteer time, not just for monthly meetings, but for other committee meetings and training sessions. All this is done because we have a village we love and we want to make even better.

Though new to the position, Mark Tiller, our CAO, is doing a fine job—when he doesn't outright know the answers to our questions, he finds them out. Mark is one of our two paid positions, the other being the janitor and groundskeeper.

As residents, we ask for your patience, but we also encourage your questions. Share your ideas about things that need attention in the village. We will work together to do great things for the future of the Rural Municipality of Murray Harbour.

Cherry Nut Shortbread

1 c. unsalted butter ⅔ c. icing sugar 1 egg 1 tsp. vanilla 1-½ c. flour 1 c. cherries 1 c. chopped nuts

In a large bowl, use an electric mixer to beat butter and sugar until creamy. Beat in egg then vanilla. Gradually beat in flour—don't overbeat. Stir in cherries. Wrap dough and put in fridge for 30 minutes.

Divide into thirds and shape each piece in a roll 1-1/2" wide. Roll each piece in nuts on wax paper. Wrap rolls and put in fridge for 3 hours or up to a week.

Heat oven to 350. Slice rolls into ½" slices. Place 1" apart on cookie sheet. Bake 10 minutes or until golden.
