2019 - 2020 Budget

On March 13, Council passed our first budget for the Rural Municipality of Murray Harbour. The 2019-2020 budget can be viewed on the village website at www.murrayharbour.ca. We also have to submit a proposed four-year budget to the government.


The next meeting of the SKCDC will be held on **Monday, April 15 at 6:30 pm** at the Community Centre. All area business owners and members of the community are welcome.



Planning Committee Report

The mandate of this committee is to implement our municipal planning bylaw, as directed by the Province's Municipal Government Act. The committee, comprised of W. Glen White (Chair), Derek Squirell (Co-chair), Paul White (Mayor), Margaret Vanlderstine (Councillor), and Mark Tiller (CAO), has held three meetings this year. We have a 93-page draft bylaw to review and edit. The process has been time consuming but has proven to be educational for all committee members.

It is expected to take several more meetings before we finish reviewing the draft document and then additional time to develop all the required associated forms. We will then prepare a presentation for residents of our municipality so we can receive input and feedback.

Finally, we will be required to apply to the Province for final approval before the bylaw can be implemented. Our target date for completion of the process is the end of 2021, which is one year before the mandatory implementation date.

Sewage Utility Board

Items addressed at the February 12 meeting included a decision to put all grass cutting for the village under one contract and to order a stand-by pump. The next meeting of the board is May 13 at 6 pm. \square

Crackle Top Ginger Cookies

Enid Clements' recipe from Sarah Jackson's 'A Collection of Favorite Recipes' (with permission)

1-1/2 c. shortening

2 eggs

2 c. sugar

½ c. molasses

4 c. flour

3 tsp. ginger

4 tsp. soda

1 tsp. salt

1 tsp cinnamon

Cream shortening and sugar; add eggs. Add remaining ingredients. Roll into balls and roll in a little white sugar. Do not press down. Bake at 375° F for 10 to 12 min.
