2022 Murray Harbour Farmer's Market Photo Contest Rules:

- 1. The area for taking pictures will encompass what is known as the Murray Harbour Fire District.
- 2. There will be three separate categories:
 - a) Landscapes and Landmarks and/or The Sea and Our Waters;
 - b) Our People and/or Our Pets; and
 - c) Our Lighthouses and Range Lights.

Please be sure to ask people for their permission before taking their picture and explain what it is for.

3. No drone pictures.

- 4. Limit of 3 photos per entrant in total for any combination of categories (e.g., 1 from each category, 3 from 1 category, 2 from I category and 1 from another).
- 5. Photos must have been taken within the past 12 months of the contest deadline.
- 6. Entrants must forward their submissions to the Murray Harbour Farmers Market via messenger/email or its representative no earlier than August 1, 2022 and no later than the contest submission deadline of August 13, 2022.

A panel of professionals in the field will select a winner from each category and a 'People's Choice' winner will be selected during a vote held at the August 27th Market. Anyone at the Market on that day will be eligible to vote for their favourite picture.

Winners will be announced on the afternoon of August 27.

Update on Canadian Community Building Fund Projects

Deputy mayor Carol White is pleased to announce that after an unforeseen delay, the "IN HONOUR FOR THOSE WHO ARE LOST AT SEA" Monument is moving forward. An on-site meeting between the committee and consulting architect was recently held to discuss the layout of the area where the monument will be located, integrating the history of the area into the project and creating a space where everyone feels a sense of peace. As we await the architect's design, the process of locating a contractor to carry out the concrete portion of the monument is underway.

Tara Callaghan of Haute Nature Design has been hired to help with this monument, the Community Garden, the Outdoor Sport and Recreation Infrastructure, and the Heritage Park.





A public washroom is planned adjacent to the soccer field and community garden area. The sanitary for the washroom, along with the sidewalk extension on main street, are being designed by WSP engineering and will be going to tender this month.

We are on schedule for solar panel installations later this summer by SUNLY. The 27.45 kW rated system will have capacity to produce 31,000 kWh annually and will be a great help to reducing our electric bill significantly.

Two humidex control units have been added to the community centre basement, further improving the conditions. RM Ventilation (Ryan Murphy) was the contractor and did an excellent job with this and the heat recovery ventilator (HRV) install. Painting was completed by Color Array (Travis MacLean).

Tips for Tick Season

With the return of warm weather, preventing tick bites that can cause Lyme disease and other infections should be top of mind! To help prevent tick bites:

- wear light-coloured long-sleeved shirts and pants to spot ticks more easily
- tuck your shirt into your pants, and pull your socks over your pant legs
- use bug spray containing the ingredients DEET or Icaridin on your skin and clothing (always follow the directions on the label)
- walk on cleared paths or walkways
- when you return, take time to inspect your body for ticks

Don't forget to check your pets too!
