Butler's Clover Farm Wins!

Congratulations to Butler's Clover Farm for winning The Eastern PEI Chamber of Commerce Community Impact Award! It was presented at the 15th Annual Business Excellence Awards presentation held at the Fiddling Fisherman Lookout on March 24, 2022. What a fitting recognition for this hub of the community. We are forever grateful for their contributions to our village! Here is the bio that was read out at the awards ceremony:

In March, 2020 and the ensuing days (and eventually years), as our world was turned upside down due the pandemic and the ensuing lockdown, Otis and Linda Butler stepped forward, going above and beyond, to ensure the food and essential resources needed to sustain our small rural community as well as the Island overall were available.

Although convenience stores and service stations were located in the area, Butler's Clover Farm in Murray Harbour was the only grocery/hardware/liquor store within a 20-mile radius (minimum). When supplies in larger centres became scarce or non-existing,



Islanders drove to Butler's in Murray Harbour to obtain these supplies. Linda and Otis used foresight and creativity to ensure the needs of their customers were met.

At a time when their customers were stressed mentality and financially, Linda and Otis showed true leadership and compassion to all those in the community who came in or called. They delivered goods to those who could either not leave their homes due to physical restraints or mental stress. During this time of financial stress, the Butlers never saw anyone go without and were always

there to lift their customers 'up' by lending an ear, offering a helping hand or easing their financial restraints. All acts of kindness were unspoken and truly showed not only the commitment this couple had for this community but the belief that no matter who we are, we need each other to exist and thrive. Linda and Otis' caring and concern extended beyond their customers, however, and ensured the needs of their staff and suppliers were always first and foremost in their minds.

The community of Murray Harbor and area was and continues to be served by the compassionate actions of Linda and Otis Butler. Their leadership during the pandemic and until this day, has allowed this area and beyond, to live in a sense of normality which would not have been possible without their leadership, foresight and caring hearts.

Thanks so much to James for this fantastic original! \square




Breaking News for Garden Enthusiasts

A community garden is a shared, semi-public space where people in the surrounding neighborhood can have a garden plot for growing fruits, vegetables, and flowers. These are quite social spaces and wonderful places for sharing knowledge and experiences. The garden area would be fenced with a tool

storage shed, power, water, a washroom, and a compost/recycling area in addition to individual raised beds.

This would be a fun, educational gathering place and would absolutely appeal to those who want to share their love of gardening with others especially those who have never thought of raising their own vegetables or flowers.

We rent the Community Centre Hall on a seasonal basis. Although we never solicit the community for prizes, we are always humbled and grateful when we are contacted by those offering prizes.

After all expenses are paid, the Murray Harbour Farmers Market has been able, over the years, to donate surplus money from our "glass bottle" to organizations in the community, including to the SKC Breakfast Program, Montague Food Bank, Montague Group Home, Turkey Drive, SKC Home and

School, as well as other worthy causes and individuals in the area.

Tours of Murray Harbour

For the summer of 2022, we will once again be offering the Murray Harbour Historical Walking Tour as well as our newest walking tour which we like to call "Eerie We Arr!" ... a ghostly walk through the village.

The Historical Walking Tour of Murray Harbour will take place every Monday morning from July 4 to August 29 at 10 am. The tour will begin and end at the Murray Harbour Community Centre and will take approximately 1 ½ hours. Private tours can be booked in advance (walking and coach tours for buses) with times for private tours being outside the Monday, 10 am timeframe.

Our "Eerie We Arr!", a ghostly walking tour through the village will be held on Wednesday evenings from July 6 to August 31, beginning at dusk. This tour which will highlight the tales of old (and some not so old) will begin and end at the Murray Harbour Community Centre, taking approximately 1 ½ hours. Be sure to bring your bug spray, a flashlight, COMFORTABLE walking shoes, and an open mind!

It is best to book ahead as tours are limited to 20 persons. Children under 12 must be accompanied by an adult. Bug spray, your sunscreen, a hat, and COMFORTABLE walking shoes are recommended! A Day In The Life Of Murray Harbour

The Murray Harbour Farmers Market is thrilled to announce on April 21, 2022, the first screening in the 2022 Murray Harbour Farmers Market Community Series "A Day in the Life of Murray Harbour" will be presented.

In the mid-1980s, CBC developed and filmed a series of documentaries of various Island communities which spoke of their sense of community and home, and we have been able to locate the film on Murray Harbour. The screening will be held at the Murray Harbour Community Centre beginning at 7 pm. Seating will be at 75% capacity (approximately 75 persons). Masks and social distancing at this event will be in accordance with the restrictions and procedures of the PEI Department Public Health effective April 21.

If you would like to reserve a seat or two, feel free to contact us. Although no admission will be charged, donations are always appreciated to defer costs of the market during the 2022 season and to assist local groups and fundraisers. Light refreshments will be available, free of charge. If demand warrants it, another showing will be scheduled during the summer of 2022 for our summer residents and visitors.

So circle April 21st on your calendar. You'll see some faces from the past on the screen (many who sadly are no longer with us), get the chance to listen to their thoughts on their Murray Harbour AND who knows, you could be one of the people on the screen!

Canadian Community Building Fund Projects

There are many projects planned for Murray Harbour in 2022 under the old federal "Gas Tax" program, now called the Community Building Fund, some new and some in progress:

Memorial Park for Seafarers: To be established at the lookout on south side of the bridge. The lookout will also have repair and maintenance completed.

Green Energy: The Community center is looking into alternate energy sources to offset a very high electric bill. This includes solar and geothermal. We also are "on the list" for an Electric Car charging station installation.

Sewage Lagoon Access Road and Fencing: to be completed with an entrance gate installed.

Community Garden/Public Washroom: see article in this newsletter.

Soccer Field: to be completed this year. The new moveable nets were a big hit last year.

Community Centre Basement: The Heat Recovery Ventilator (HRV) system is installed. Humidex control will be added, and the floors and walls are painted. The basement now has much improved air quality to protect storage and be available for future activities.

Sidewalk Extension: New sidewalk from the Post Office to the Robertson Road corner.

Repair of existing concrete sidewalk will also be completed.

Outdoor Sports and Recreation

Infrastructure: Adjacent to the children's playground senior friendly exercise equipment and basketball courts upgrade.

Heritage Park: Construct a small parquette in front of Community Centre with relocation of the old school bell as a centerpiece.

Future considerations include the development of a senior friendly housing complex adjacent to Faye Fraser Drive. The dog parks would be relocated/downsized to accommodate this project. A walking trail/boardwalk along waterfront on Riverside Drive is also being contemplated.



New Flag for Murray Harbour

A new flag design was voted on last year at the Farmer's Market, and the winning design was by Steward MacLean—well done Steward! Council hopes to have the new flag flying soon. We are also looking at purchasing seasonal banners to be installed on the bridge light standards.

It's an Election Year!

Municipalities across PEI will be holding Municipal Elections this fall.

On Monday, November 7 there will be an election of a new Village Council to take office in March 2023. It will be to elect a mayor and 6 councilors for a four-year term. If you are interested in one of these positions, call the Village Office at 902-962-3835.

Murray Harbour 2022-2023 Operating Budget

By the time this newsletter is published the Murray Harbour 2022-2023 fiscal year operating budget will have been submitted to the PEI government. Our total budget is approximately \$250,000 with only about 7% of this being costs that the Village can control! The rest are mandatory or essential services required to operate a relatively small municipality (pop. 282).

Did you know it costs upwards of \$10,000/yr to power our streetlights? Add in the village office complex and our Maritime Electric bill pushes \$30,000/yr. Insurance just rose by over 15% to \$24,000/yr and the village's share of the mandatory financial audit is in the order of \$7,000 each year. Our outstanding mortgages add another substantial financial burden. Needless to say, making ends meet is a challenge. Property taxes did increase this year after 0% increase last year.

Our volunteers and fund raisers are a critical part of our ability to present a balanced budget. To all of you that donate your time and efforts, a most appreciative thank you! A special thank you to the lobster fishers that donated so generously in 2021 for our lobster dinner fund raiser, which was another huge success!


