1. Call to Order:

2. Declaration of Conflict of Interest

3. Approval of Agenda

Maintenance

The village request for walkway repair on either side of the bridge is under consideration by the Department of Transportation and Infrastucture, and they will survey the area. Our case is strong because we are asking only for restoration of "what we had" before the bridge reconstruction.

A streetlight has recently been installed at Mariners Lane / Main Street intersection.

<u>Insurance</u>

Hurricane Fiona damage at Rail Head Park (eavestroughs and signage) has been confirmed as an insured Risk and estimates for their repair/replacement are being obtained.

The insurer will provide a boilerplate harassment policy to be adapted for the Village. The draft policy will be circulated in advance of the next meeting and brought to the June meeting for approval.

Road clean-up will proceed weather permitting as crews move through the area. Broken or damaged curbs or landscaping need to be reported by residents directly to the roads department; clean-up crews are not responsible for assessing and initiating repairs.

In response to the suggested litter clean-up day, several councillors volunteered that this was already organised by the WI. No further action.
