#### Remembering Faye

Only a few short months ago our community lost one of its greatest leaders, a loss that will be felt for many years to come. Faye Fraser was a visionary and driving force behind countless initiatives in the community such as the street lights and sewer system, Railhead Park, a playground and ball diamond (which later became tennis courts), the sound system, and the recently erected, Fishers Memorial. While there are many tangible artifacts of the work Faye did in our community, she also spent many hours sharing her talents through the Drama Club, ceilidhs, local rinks, Stanley Cup parades, and her church choir.

Faye's community leadership was the 'roll up your sleeves' kind. It has been written that she, along with neighbour and fellow councillor Linda Penny, removed rocks from a field so it could become a ball diamond and they physically stepped off

and marked the locations for the street lights. She even worked the sound system at her own surprise Jubilee Medal event!

Faye served on the village council for 33 years. While these many years of leadership saw their share of challenges, she is remembered for her perseverance and always having the best interest of the village in mind. In 2010 she received the award for 'outstanding contribution to a municipality' from the PEI Federation of



#### Community Centre Renovations Complete

Thanks to funding through the PEI Government's Rural Growth Initiative and Reception Centre Resiliency Fund, we were able to do some upgrades to the Centre to improve its ability to be a Designated Reception Centre during emergencies. Improvements include accessible door entrances, kitchen worktops and appliances, heaters in the bathrooms and a new passageway from the main hall to the rear entrance. While these changes help the emergency services we provide, they will also benefit centre users throughout the year.

The final addition to the centre for this project will be a new set of fire-resistant stage curtains. These curtains were partially funded by the generous donations made through Faye Fraser's funeral and will be embroidered with the initials F.F.

A huge thank you to Sonia and Clint with the provincial government, special thanks to Reggie Cantin and his crew at Renovations By the Sea, and kudos to Councillor Pam Oickle who initiated and managed this project on behalf of the village. Please stop by anytime to check out the renovations!

**Hootenanny** on Thursday nights 7 to 9 pm; all musicians welcome to come jam.



### Rural Municipality of Murray **Harbour Committee Updates**

2025-2026 Budget

The Village operating budget of \$326,056 was approved by Council on March 26th this year. Major expenses including insurance, loan burdens, payroll, infrastructure maintenance, audit, and utilities represent half of all expenditures. Total income is estimated at \$327,467, leaving a balance of +\$1,411. Major income sources are equalization payments from the government, property taxes, hall rentals, and fundraising; representing two-thirds of all income.

#### Capital Expenditures

The Canadian Community Building Fund (CCBF, previously known as the Gas Tax) is fully committed for the next 5 years pending approval of recent applications. Planned projects include investments into recreational infrastructure, cultural infrastructure, and community energy systems. For more information on these projects, you can contact Deputy Mayor Gary MacKay or the village office.

Thank you to everyone who took the time to send in suggestions for projects. While many did not meet the criteria for CCBF funding, eligible recreational infrastructure ideas received were

incorporated into the applications. Please continue to share your ideas any time.

#### Infrastructure Maintenance

Major projects for this year include painting the exterior of the community centre and installing eavestrough. The total budget for maintenance is \$39,000, of which two-thirds will be used by these projects. The remaining funds will be used for regularly scheduled maintenance on the HVAC systems and repair and upkeep on the buildings and properties owned by the village.

#### Fundraising and Events Committee

We hosted two free events in recent months: a Christmas Dinner for Seniors and an Easter Extravaganza for families. Thank you so much to the volunteers and donors who helped make these possible!

## This Summer at Ocean Acres and The Deck




There are many reasons to gather at The Deck and they have something for all ages!

The Murray Harbour Library continues to thrive as a vibrant community space providing free and equitable access to information (free Wifi, Saltwire ePaper), supporting lifelong learning and providing an inclusive hub of learning, culture, and connection.

Your library card gives you access to all libraries across the province and a dizzying array of books, DVDs, and games, as well as our ever-expanding library of THINGS. Your library card is also a gateway to our online digital media, to a day pass for TCAP, and a Heritage Pass, which provides free entrance for your family to one of the participating Heritage sites across PEI during the summer months.

The library continues to support community programs such as the Women's Institute Roadside Cleanup, battery recycling, and the Community Volunteer Income Tax Program (CVITP), which ran for the first time at the library this year. CVITP volunteers prepare returns for eligible taxpayers with a low to modest income, so if you missed taking advantage of this great program, be sure to be ready to take advantage of it next

year during tax season.

Monthly programs, such as an egg-felting workshop with Margaret Brady last month, continue to attract an enthusiastic bunch, so if you know someone, possibly yourself, who has a special skill and is willing to lead a craft, or teach a new skill, we would love to hear from you.
